It's time to Change the Conversation.

This past year has been a significant one for our agency. Following an extensive stakeholder engagement process, we entered a new chapter for our organization, an evolution that will help serve even more people impacted by domestic violence and abuse in Calgary.

In recent years, you've heard us say "*we're more than a shelter*". Because we are. But because of our name, many people didn't know the real us.

They didn't know what we offer and question if they should reach out for help, or not. Most people didn't see our name as having something to offer them. We've never been just for women and we've always been more than a shelter.

The Calgary Women's Emergency Shelter began as it is today—a much needed and critical support for women experiencing violence and abuse. Growing out of the clear vision and deep sense of care of our founders nearly 50 years ago, the work continues today as a beacon in the community.

The face of domestic violence and abuse has changed dramatically over the years and is now much more complex. The experience of domestic abuse cuts across, gender, economic and social boundaries in ways that have demanded us to work better and smarter to care for all involved. When people of all genders and ages experience violence, shelter isn't the only thing they need. The Calgary Women's Emergency Shelter name no longer captures the true impact we have in the community.

FearIsNotLove is our new name. It acts as an avenue to launch a major social change movement and help elevate the conversation around domestic violence and abuse. It's who we are. And it's what we stand for.

Neglect, violence and abuse are life-altering, terrorizing behaviours.

We call attention to the behaviours that lead partners and family members to not feel safe to be who they are, to feel afraid to speak their minds, and to feel terrified in their own homes. This can happen to anyone—regardless of how strong, intelligent, capable, educated, resilient or successful they are.

It's a standard that everyone, especially young people, can use to assess the health of their close relationships.

FearIsNotLove tackles the unfair assumptions, embarrassment and shame that have been attached to domestic violence and abuse for too long.

FearIsNotLove applies to both the victims and the people who use abuse and who want to change their behaviour.

The work we do is critically important. We are transforming and saving lives. We are helping people make different choices for themselves and carving new paths. We want to offer more help,

serve more people, and get involved earlier, so we can actually stop domestic violence and abuse from happening in our community.

Now as **FearIsNotLove**, many more people impacted by neglect, violence and abuse will recognize that they can find help here. Our goal is to help people to have violence-free lives, to live without fear, and get to the ultimate outcome—love. It's what we all want and need.

The Calgary Women's Emergency Shelter facility is, and always will be, an integral part of our services. This will not change. It is a key part of who we are and who we serve, but it's time for a shelter to become a movement. It's time for us to start new dialogue and change the conversation about domestic violence and abuse. Moving our cause forward.

We know that with this courageous step, we will have a larger, more visible and an even louder platform to reach people. To connect, educate and inform, and to raise our sights on helping more people who need us.

Our agency is always committed to ongoing improvement and finding new ways to ensure we are a healthy and informed organization. The 2023-2026 strategic plan will continue with the great work from the previous plan, while creating new possibilities and building a foundation for focused operations and practice in our new evolution. As we look ahead, we will continue to collaborate with diverse stakeholders, including a commitment to engage with the calls to action of the Truth and Reconciliation Report.

We cannot do this crucial work alone. Our donors, funders, supporters, community partners, staff and volunteers are a key part of our path forward in this bold new direction. Thank you for your generous and ongoing support.

PROGRAMS & SERVICES

FearIsNotLove supports individuals, families and communities to live free from domestic violence and abuse. We serve all people to live free from fear, neglect, violence, and abuse through a comprehensive range of innovative programs and services.



CONNECT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE & ABUSE HELPLINE

Crisis counselling, information and referrals for anyone needing support with domestic violence and abuse. Trained counsellors answer the phone 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Multi-lingual support is available. Text and email support are also available.



CALGARY WOMEN'S EMERGENCY SHELTER

A 50-bed secure shelter for adults who identify as women, with or without children, who are fleeing domestic violence and abuse. Stay is for up to 21 days.



COMMUNITY SERVICES COUNSELLING

Offers counselling to any person in the community experiencing abuse, violence, or neglect in their close relationships. Counselling is offered in-person at a safe location, through virtual technology, and over the phone.



COURT PROGRAM

Help with navigation of the court system, for anyone who has experienced domestic violence and abuse and identifies as a woman.



MEN'S RESOURCE LINE

Phone counselling, information and support for individuals in the area of emotional and relational wellness. Available 24 hours per day, 365 days a year.



HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS PROGRAM FOR YOUTH

Individual and group counselling for youth who have concerns about their close relationships.



MEN'S COUNSELLING SERVICE

Individual and group counselling for adults interested in creating or enhancing safety in their close relationships.



TAKE A STAND INITIATIVE

An educational program designed to help informal supporters provide helpful responses to people who are experiencing domestic violence and abuse.



CHILD, YOUTH & FAMILY THERAPY PROGRAM

Counselling for children and their parents, when there has been domestic violence and abuse in the home.

An online resource offering trusted, accessible support, information and resources for the complex mental and relational health challenges men face.

PROGRAM OUTCOMES

100% of women who accessed the **Emergency Shelter** indicate that they feel safe from their abuser while in shelter.

95% of clients served through **Community Services Counselling** report they have learned how to keep themselves safe.

99% of **Take A Stand** participants feel more confident to respond to someone who discloses domestic violence and abuse, in a supportive, non-judgemental way.

100% of clients who accessed the **Court Program** indicate that they have a better understanding of the court process.

93% of parents have seen a positive change in their child as a result of the supports they received from the **Child, Youth and Family Therapy Program**.

77% of men served through **Men's Counselling Service** report that they are able to handle conflict and stress in a way that is respectful towards their partner.

90% of youth indicate that they have learned the skills to help build **Healthy Relationships** through their participation of the program.

HIGHLIGHTS

Dignity for Children & Youth: It takes a Village

In February 2023, we presented an International Conference: *Dignity for Children & Youth: It takes a Village*. The conference focused on effective, respectful practice in the field of domestic violence by centering the work on the safety and dignity of children. More than 400 guests and speakers from all over the world attended the free 3-day event, both in person and virtually. The goal of the conference was to build better capacity in the domestic violence sector. After launching Men & and the accompanying men's resource line in 2021, this past year we, we scaled the digital resources of the project. Turning Points Fundraising Gala—A New Day

On April 21, 2022, we hosted the Turning Points Gala, *A New Day*—our first in person event since 2019. Hosted by Dave Kelly, distinguished guests, community leaders and supporters joined together to help raise awareness and funds for our agency. The evening featured a panel discussion about family violence prevention and our work with children and youth with the Domestic Conflict Response Team of the Calgary Police Service, our CEO—Kim Ruse and front line staff. An inspiring musical segment was also performed by vocal ensemble Remix: Powered by Revv52. Thank you to our generous sponsors, supporters and guests for making the event a huge success, raising \$665,607 in support of those we serve in the community.

Men's Cultural Helpers Program

This men's Indigenous healing project was launched this year, which includes Cultural Helpers that work to support Indigenous men build healthy relationship practices. It promotes health and healing by strengthening cultural traditions and teachings. Part of the Men & project, this initiative works towards establishing restorative and Land Based programming to augment and offer alternatives to mainstream therapeutic support. This learning approach offers active participation in community-based on reserve ceremonial activities aimed at physical engagement with elders' wisdom and teaching. It helps men understand their traditional role as provider for the family within modern times and focuses on how to rediscover a sense of community, and reclaim the roles of Father, Husband, Brother, Partner, and Son in a positive and healthy way.

This year, **FearIsNotLove** continued to experience increased demand for our services. To meet this demand, we leveraged our financial surplus to invest in innovative service delivery and to increase the number and types of supports we offer. The community and our stakeholders contributed to 5% growth in overall revenue (excluding emergency government funding), and we are grateful for the ongoing support and generosity.

We are focused on developing new, stable funding to ensure we are able to meet the growing and changing needs of our community. We look forward to working with our partners, stakeholders and community to change the conversation about domestic violence and abuse.

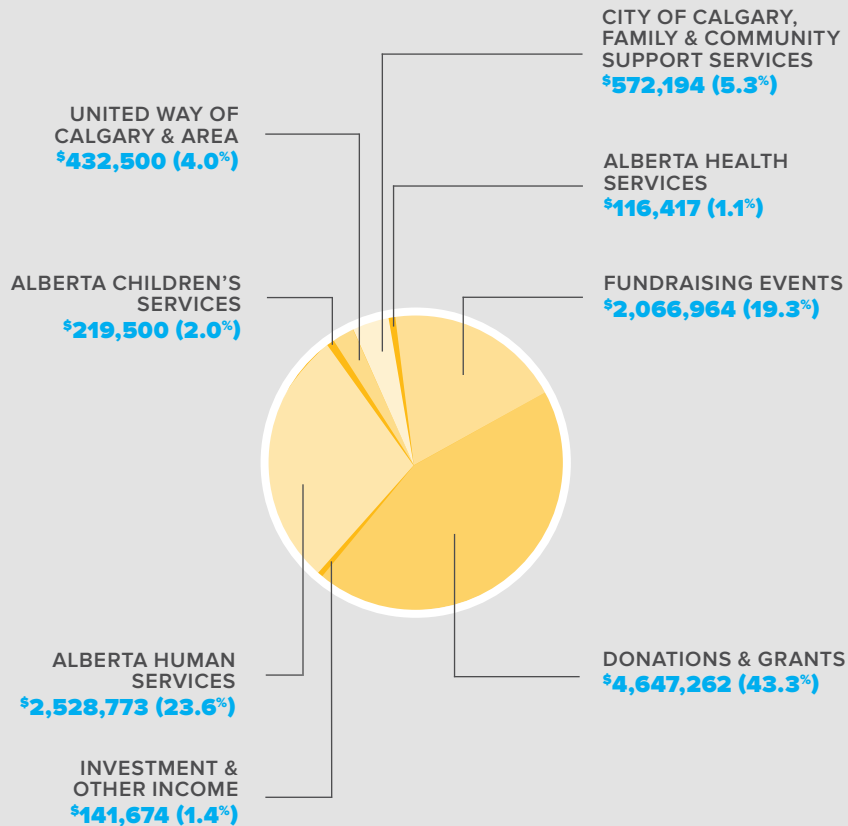

FISCAL PERIOD ENDED MARCH 31, 2023

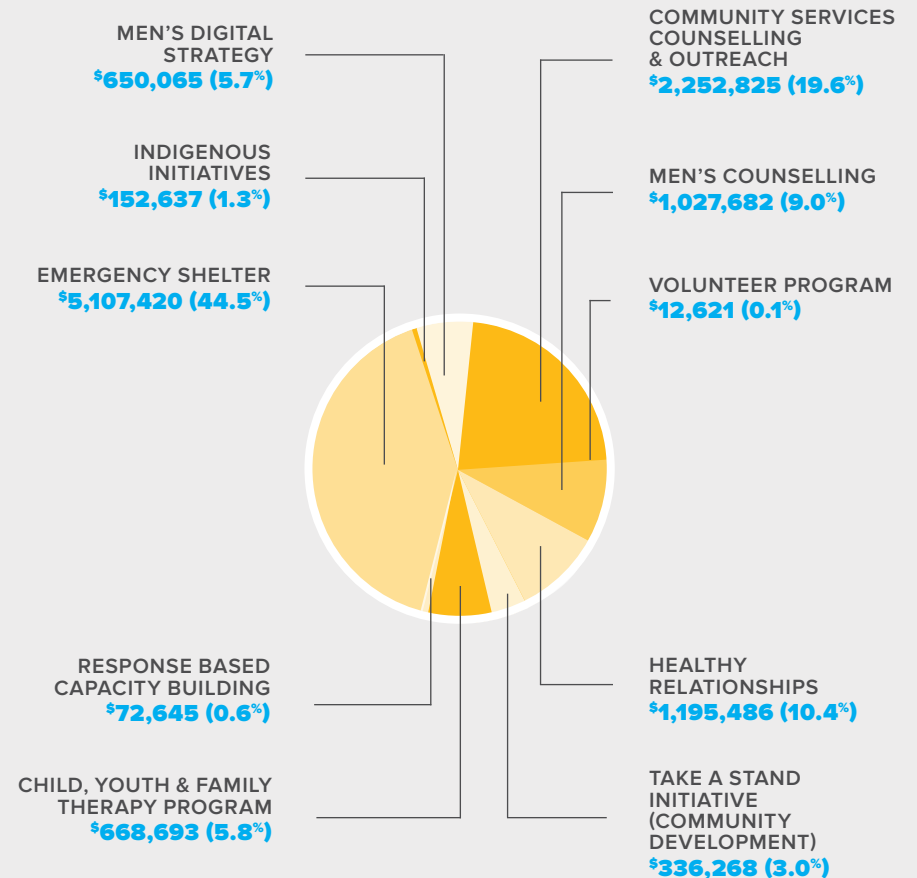
FUNDING SOURCES 2022-2023
