Together with our community, we are working to shift understanding, reduce stigma, and strengthen responses to domestic violence and abuse, creating lasting change in how it is understood and addressed.

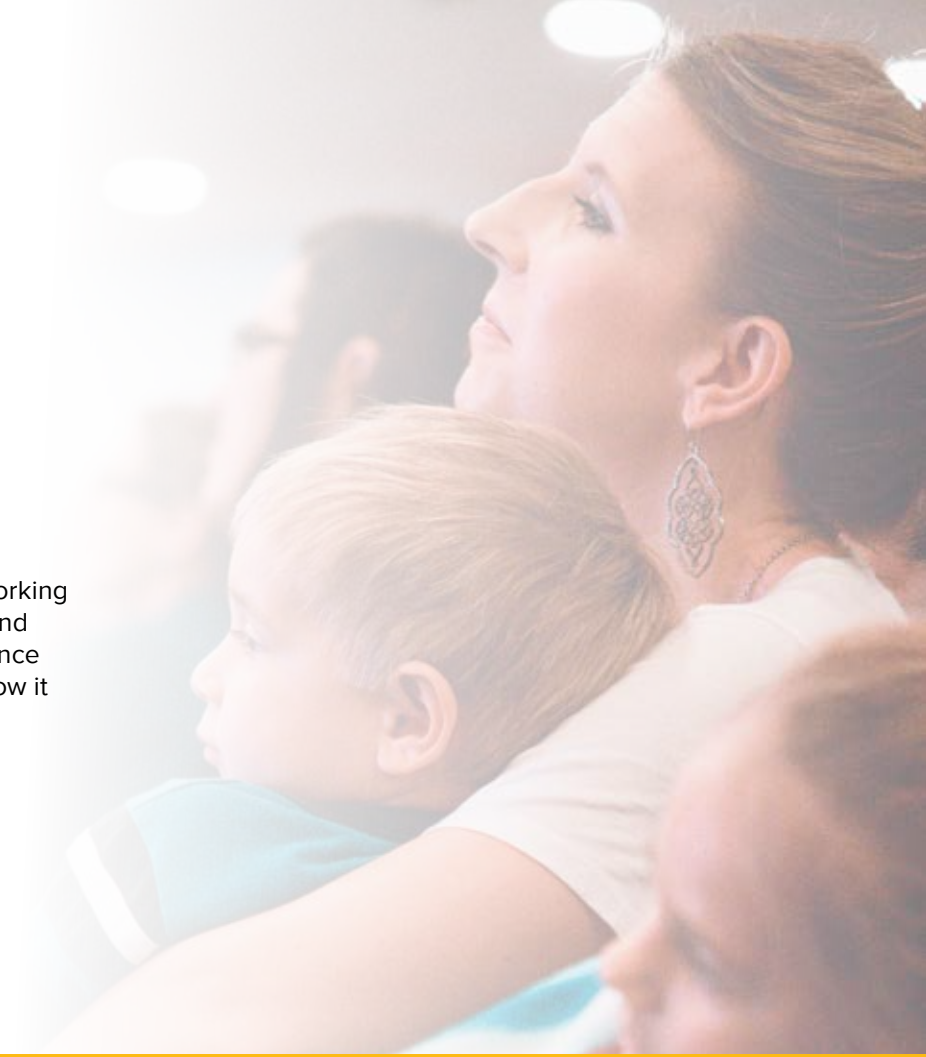

CEO & PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Domestic violence and abuse remains one of the most significant public safety issues facing our communities. While it often occurs behind closed doors, it impacts families, workplaces, schools, healthcare systems, and communities as a whole.

Violence and abuse are never private matters. They affect all of us, and addressing them requires a shared commitment to safety, prevention, intervention, accountability, and lasting change.

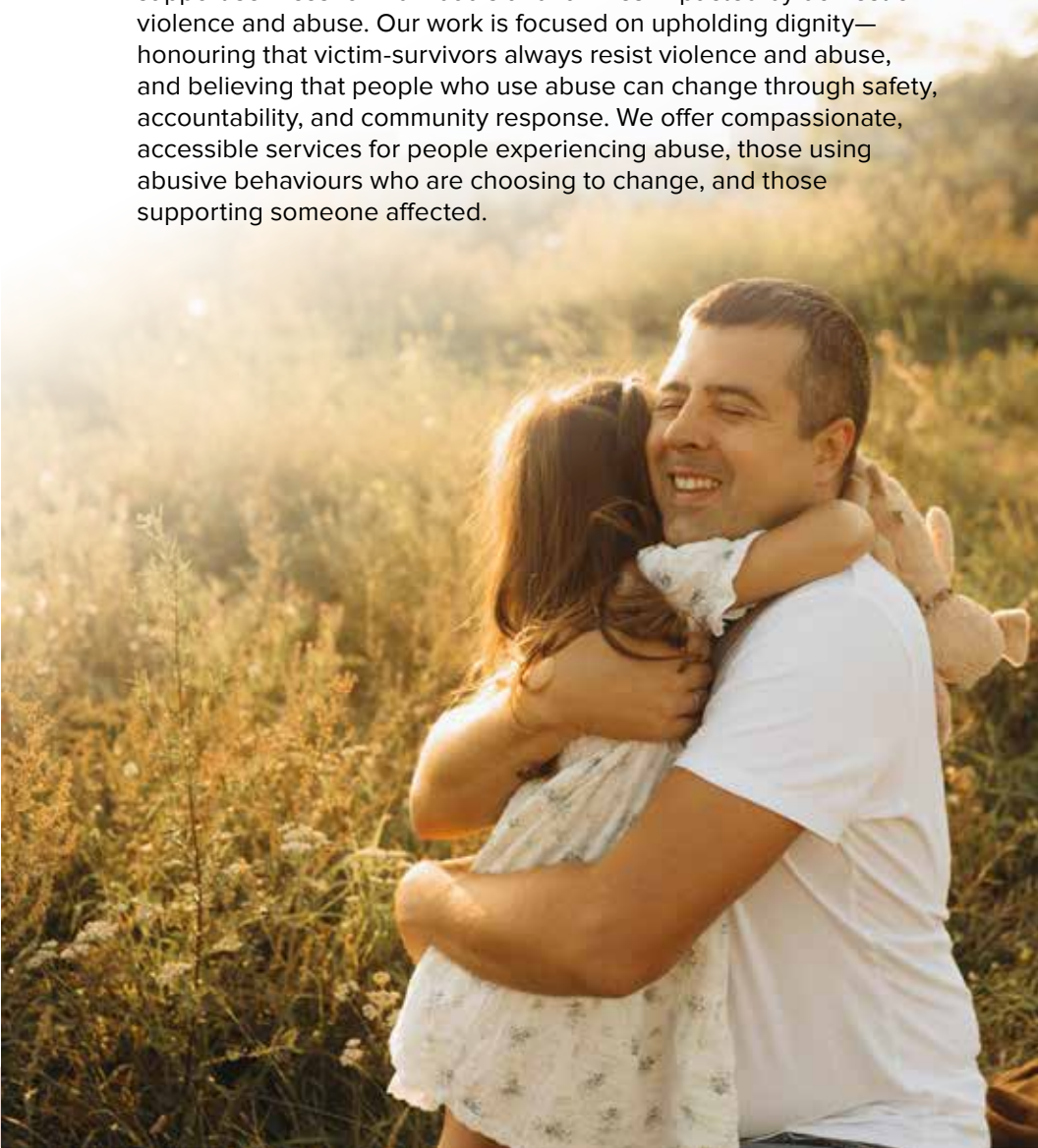

PROGRAMS & RESOURCES

FearIsNotLove provides prevention, intervention, education, and support services for individuals and families impacted by domestic violence and abuse. Our work is focused on upholding dignity—honouring that victim-survivors always resist violence and abuse, and believing that people who use abuse can change through safety, accountability, and community response. We offer compassionate, accessible services for people experiencing abuse, those using abusive behaviours who are choosing to change, and those supporting someone affected.



Shelter Services



Connect Domestic Violence & Abuse Helpline

Provides crisis counselling, safety planning, information, intake into all FearIsNotLove programs and referrals to community resources. Available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Multi-lingual, online chat, and email support are also available.



Imminent Risk Program

A crisis-response program that provides immediate safety planning, coordinated support, and alternative emergency accommodations for individuals and families at high risk of serious domestic violence when shelter beds are at capacity.



Calgary Women's Emergency Shelter

A safe haven and secure shelter for adults who identify as women, with or without children, who are fleeing domestic violence and abuse. Some rooms can accommodate pets, helping reduce barriers for individuals leaving dangerous and unsafe situations. Children are cared for in the **Children's Activity Centre**.

Community Services & Court Program



Community Services

Counselling, safety planning, parenting support, and system navigation for individuals experiencing domestic violence and abuse. Available in-person or virtually.



Court Program

Help with navigation of the court system, for anyone who has or is experiencing domestic violence and abuse.

Therapeutic Services



Men's Counselling Service

Individual and group counselling to support adults in building safer relationships, accountability, and choosing to change harmful behaviours.



Healthy Relationships Program

Violence prevention program offering counselling for youth experiencing challenges in peer, family or dating relationships, supporting both victims and those using abusive behaviours.



Child, Youth & Family Therapy

Provides counselling and support for children, youth and family members who have experienced domestic violence and abuse in the home.



Family Healing Program

A 12-week, culturally grounded program delivered in partnership with the Tsuut'ina Stoney Corrections Society. It supports participants to take responsibility for harm, understand its impact on families and communities, and develop healthier communication and coping strategies through cultural teachings and ceremony.



Cultural Helpers

A community-based program within Men & that supports Indigenous men through cultural teachings, ceremony, and Elder guidance to strengthen identity, relationships, and healthy roles within family and community.

COMMUNITY INITIATIVES & HIGHLIGHTS

Over the past year, FearsNotLove continued to expand community engagement and public awareness efforts to deepen understanding of domestic violence and abuse as a critical public safety issue.

Through community conversations, engagement, and education initiatives, we worked to challenge misconceptions, reduce stigma, and strengthen awareness of its signs and impacts.

By increasing access to information and strengthening community capacity to respond, we are reducing barriers and supporting earlier access to help. These efforts reflect that safety and prevention are shared responsibilities, strengthened through awareness, connection, and timely support.

Men & Partnership & Regional Engagement

FearsNotLove expanded access to prevention and support through our partnership with Men & (in collaboration with Forge Social Health), connecting more men with accessible tools that support mental health, healthy relationships, and positive change. This work helps reduce stigma, encourages earlier engagement, and contributes to broader community awareness and response.

We also strengthened our presence in Airdrie and Cochrane, working with local partners to increase awareness of domestic violence as a public safety issue and improve access to information and supports across the region.

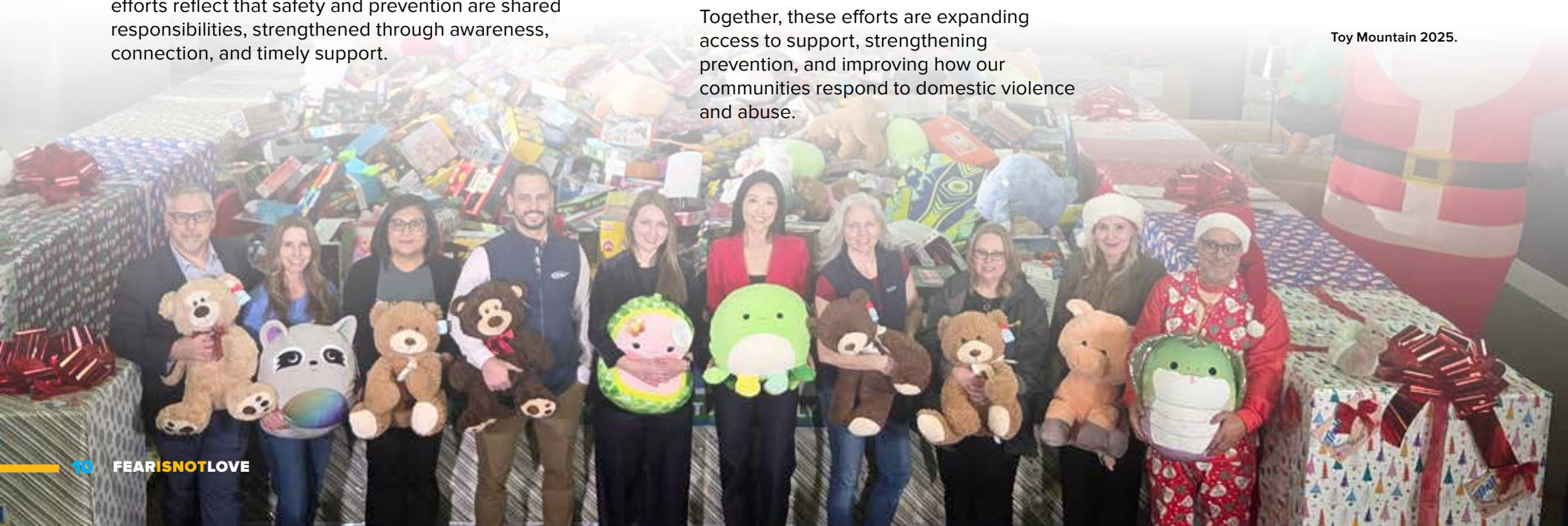
Together, these efforts are expanding access to support, strengthening prevention, and improving how our communities respond to domestic violence and abuse.

Safety Planning Toolkit Launch

This year, FearsNotLove launched the Safety Planning Toolkit, an online resource offering accessible information and interactive tools to support individuals navigating safety concerns related to domestic violence and abuse.

The toolkit provides practical guidance, personalized planning supports, and connections to services, helping reduce barriers to information and supporting informed decision-making about safety. It strengthens community awareness and supports our vision of a future free from domestic violence and abuse.

Advancing Prevention: Engaging Men

In February 2026, FearIsNotLove partnered with the University of Calgary School of Public Policy and the Calgary Police Service to launch *It Costs More to Do Nothing: Preventing Male Perpetration of Domestic Violence*, the third report in a policy series focused on prevention.

The report reinforces domestic violence as a serious public safety issue with wide-ranging impacts across policing, healthcare, housing, emergency services, and workplaces, along with significant annual system costs locally.

It also highlights the potential of prevention, showing that engaging men at risk in behaviour focused supports can reduce violence, while helping prevent harm and reduce long-term system costs.

This work reinforces the importance of early intervention, prevention, and evidence-informed approaches that support meaningful change. Together, these efforts reflect the value of early investment and approaches that strengthen safety, accountability, and change.

Turning Points Gala 2025

More than 600 community leaders, partners, advocates, and supporters came together at Turning Points 2025 on May 8, 2025, raising over \$830,000 to support prevention, intervention, and public awareness efforts.

Hosted by Dave Kelly, the evening featured performances by Wakefield Brewster and the Russell Broom Memorial Orchestra, along with a discussion on domestic violence prevention featuring Dr. Shelly Dean (Centre for Response-Based Practice), David Sannes (FearIsNotLove), and Constable Lakin Dolhan (Calgary Police Service).

Beyond fundraising, the event created space for meaningful dialogue on domestic violence and abuse as a public safety issue and reinforced the importance of collective action.

We extend our sincere gratitude to the Gala Committee, sponsors, donors, volunteers, and supporters whose generosity continues to strengthen this work.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Demand for our services continues to remain high, and I am pleased to report that the Society delivered another year of strong operational performance alongside improved financial results. Total revenue for the year remained stable at approximately \$12.3 million, supported by consistent government funding, ongoing donor generosity, and continued strength in fundraising activities. While revenue was relatively consistent year-over-year, the organization benefited from a balanced funding mix and sustained community support.

Expenses were well managed at approximately \$12.2 million, representing a reduction from the prior year. Salaries and benefits continue to be the largest component of expenditures, reflecting the people-intensive nature of our programs and the importance of maintaining a strong, dedicated team to deliver critical services.

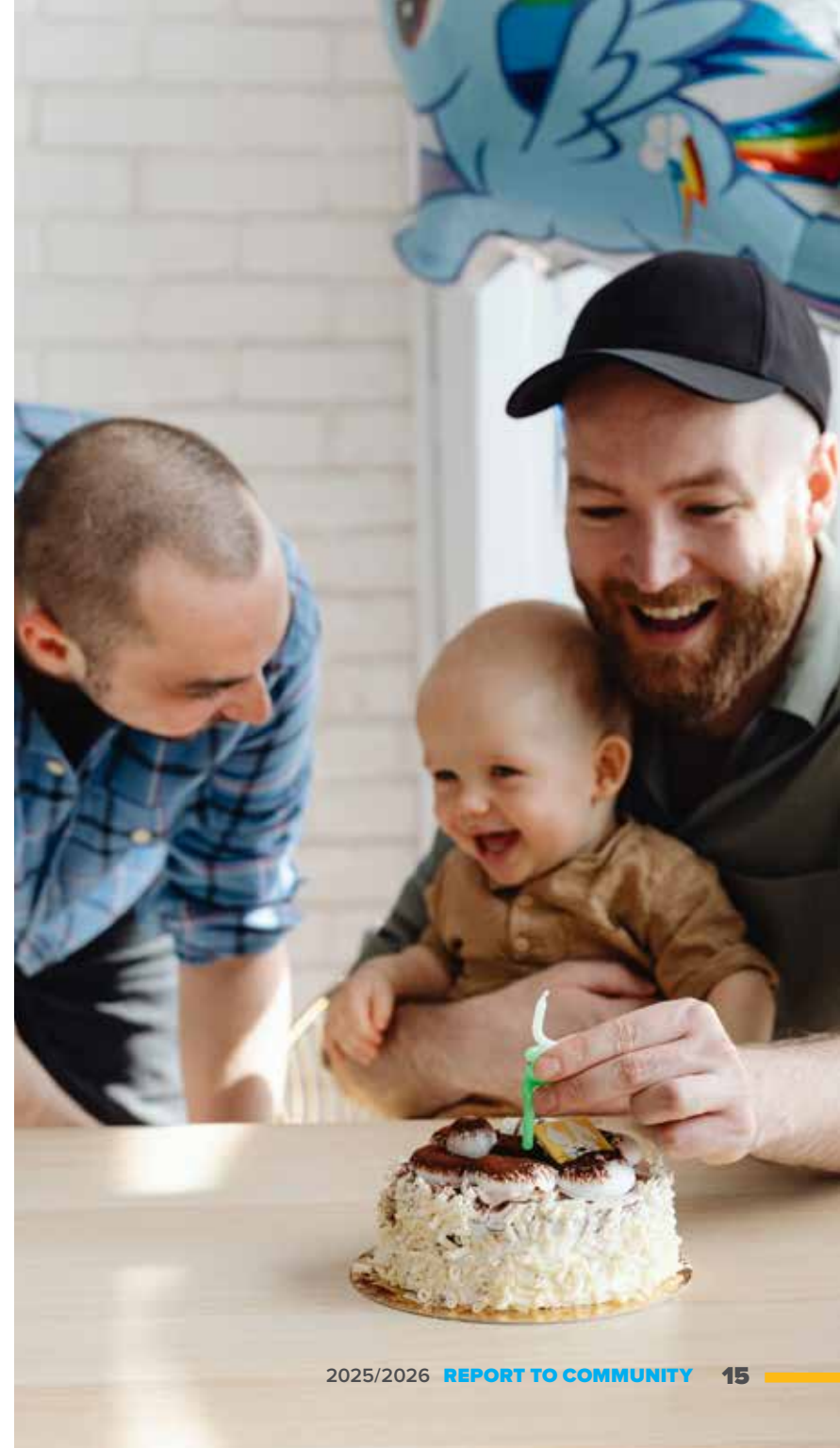
As a result, the Society recorded an overall surplus of approximately \$115,000, marking a meaningful improvement from the prior year deficit. This outcome reflects continued progress in aligning expenses with revenue, as well as the impact of disciplined cost management and stable funding.

From a balance sheet perspective, the organization remains well positioned. Cash and short-term investments increased modestly during the year, and total fund balances now stand at approximately \$3.0 million. These reserves provide sufficient liquidity to support several months of operations and ensure continuity of services for the community we serve.

While the return to a modest surplus is an encouraging step forward, we remain mindful that financial sustainability requires continued vigilance. The organization will maintain its focus on strengthening and diversifying its funding base, deepening donor engagement, and identifying sustainable revenue sources to support long-term stability.

On behalf of the Board, I would like to extend our sincere appreciation to our funders, donors, and community partners. Their continued support is essential to enabling the Society to deliver on its mission of creating a community free from domestic violence and abuse.

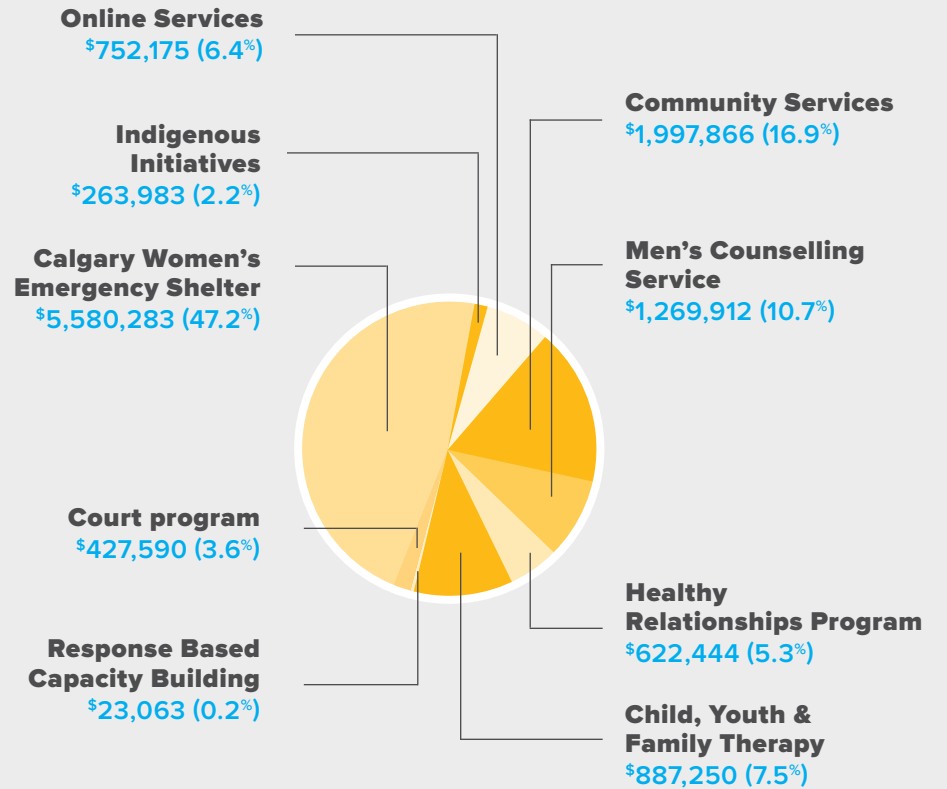
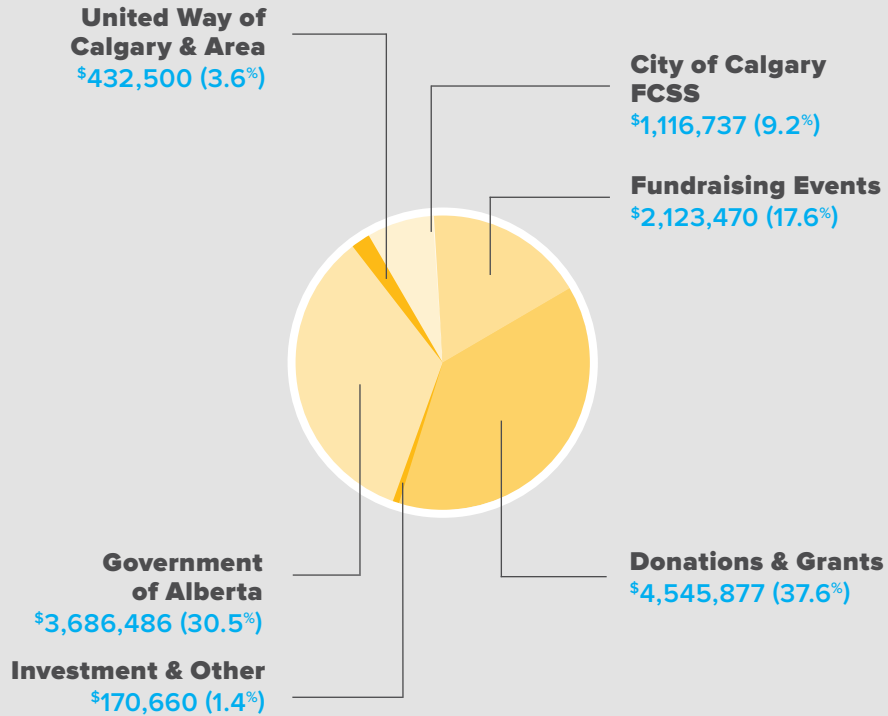


FUNDING SOURCES & USES
